The purpose of the scholarship is to teach students about the scholarship application process, the importance of having responsibilities and being an active member in the school and/or community. Applications must be completed and returned to the school Guidance Department by **March 17, 2020** or mailed to the PBA Office at P.O. Box 861, Pasadena, Maryland 21123-0861. Applications sent by mail must be postmarked no later than **March 17, 2020**. The Guidance Counselors have until the end of business on **March 18, 2020** to deliver the applications to Mary Brodowski, BB&T Bank at 3030 Mountain Road, Pasadena, who will deliver them to the PBA Office. The applications may also be dropped off to the drive through window at BB&T until 5 pm. Applications received after these dates will not be processed.

Scholarship recipients will be honored at a PBA general membership luncheon meeting on June 3, 20120 at 12 o'clock. We will send letters to the scholarship recipients in May if they are awarded a scholarship. Parents, grandparents, etc. will be able to attend this luncheon at a cost of \$20 each with a reservation. Please note that only scholarship recipients will be notified. We are not able to send letters to all applicants.

- Demonstrate humanitarian qualities in school and the community through responsible actions and involvement in school programs and/or community service above and beyond what is required.
